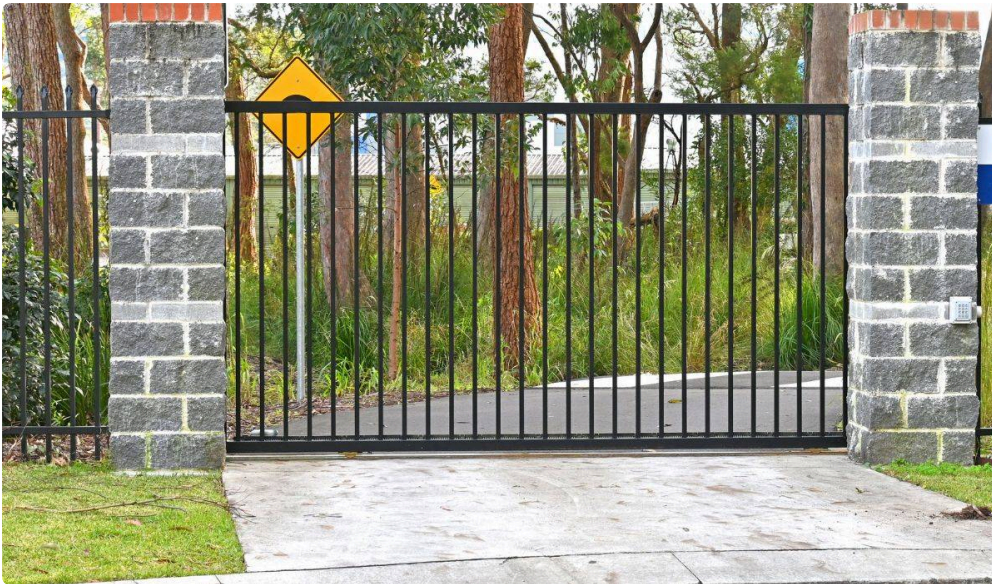


Garage door repair cost in Los Angeles varies according to the problem, the door's size and material, the hardware involved, and whether service is needed during regular hours or as emergency garage door repair. A simple adjustment may cost far less than replacing a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, opener, or an entire overhead garage door.

Average Garage Door Repair Cost in Los Angeles

Many Los Angeles homeowners can expect a routine garage door repair to fall somewhere from approximately \$100 to \$500, although more involved repairs and full replacements can cost considerably more. A minor adjustment, lubrication, or sensor correction is generally at the lower end. A broken spring, damaged cables, bent garage door tracks, or multiple failed components can raise the total.
